




Fig. 3 Peak Forward Current vs. Duty Ratio




Fig. 2 Collector Power Dissipation vs.
Ambient Temperature




Fig. 4 Forward Current vs.




Fig. 5 Collector Current vs. Forward Current




Fig. 7 Collector Current vs.

Ambient Temperature




Fig. 9 Response Time vs. Load Resistance




Fig. 6 Collector Current vs.
Collector-emitter Voltage





Fig. 8 Collector-emitter Saturation Voltage vs. Ambient Temperature



Test Circuit for Response Time




Fig.10 Frequency Response




Fig.12 Relative Collector Current vs. Shield Distance (1)




Fig.11 Collector Dark Current vs.
Ambient Temperature





Fig.13 Relative Collector Current vs. Shield Distance (2)
